



A Draught of a Survey Executed 29<sup>th</sup> of April 1813 (Called Arabia) Situate in Pine Township Allegheny County Containing Four hundred & ten acres & one hundred & nine perches & allow<sup>e</sup> of six P<sup>er</sup> Cent for Roads &c. Executed on a Warrant granted to John Emmitt dated March 23<sup>d</sup> 1813 for 400 as &c.

Note at the time of Surveying the above described Tract of land John Emmitt was residing upon <sup>the</sup> tract with his family <sup>he</sup> appeared to have about 40 acres of land Cleared and in a state of cultivation with a number of round Log buildings.

It <sup>was</sup> first improved in March 1796 as appeared in the Application on which he obtained his Warr<sup>t</sup> David Coons D.S. AC.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this second day of September 1904.
