



A Draught of a Survey called "Duncan's Delight" situate on the Waters of Raccoon Creek in Washington County contain<sup>g</sup> 364 Ac<sup>s</sup> 3 R<sup>s</sup> 22 P<sup>s</sup> and the usual allow<sup>es</sup> for Roads & C. executed Apl 27<sup>th</sup> 1786 in Pursuance of a Warrant granted to Alex<sup>s</sup> Duncan for 400 Ac<sup>s</sup> dated January y<sup>e</sup> 30<sup>th</sup> 1786.

Note, since the Survey was first made ten Ac<sup>s</sup> have been taken off adj<sup>g</sup> Geo<sup>s</sup> M<sup>s</sup> Cullough to compromise a Dispute.
