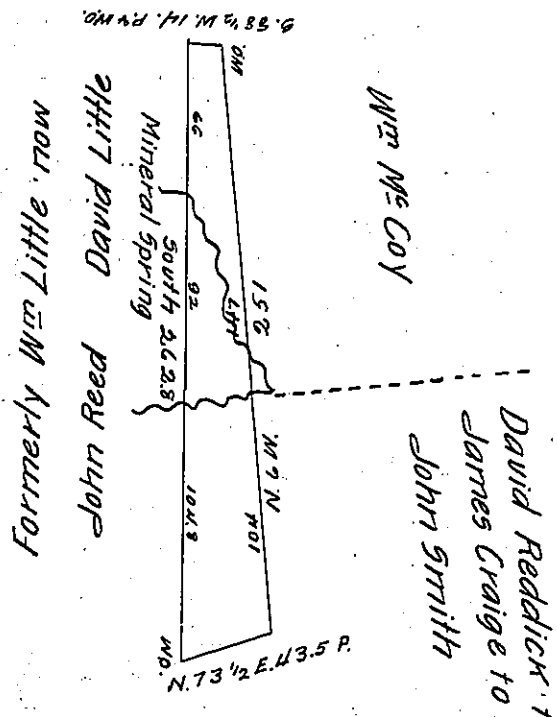

January 22nd 1836. Surveyed the above described Land upon the application of David Little of Harover township and County of Beaver, in pursuance of a Warrant granted by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to Robert Douglass dated the thirteenth of February seven-teen hundred & eighty six for forty acres of Land situate on the Waters of Raccoon Creek, Smith Township Washington County but now Beaver County Harover Township found on actual survey to contain within the settled lines forty two acres & forty seven perches and allowance of six pr ct for roads &c. Including an old improvement the same having been assigned to Andrew Robb and now in the occupancy of the aforesaid David Little; and from the Survey Book of entries in my office, for the County of Beaver there has not been ^{any} office Title or right granted granted and applied to the same land other than the title above mentioned given as a correct copy from the Survey Book in my office. South Beaver Township Beaver County the 3rd day of June 1836.
