N.B. The above piece of Land is claimed by John Bell in right of David Brown Junior on an order of Survey bearing date the 2<sup>nd</sup> of July 1767 N<sup>o</sup> 4103

Note further. The Greater part of which Tract is also claimed by Edward Dunn on an Order of Survey to Benjamin Elliott dated 18<sup>th</sup> April 1768 N<sup>o</sup> 4935.

Note further. The representation of a Survey marked A on the above Draught represented by dotted lines, appears to have been made for Henderson Harvey on the 20<sup>th</sup> of Nov. 1767 included with a larger tract but afterwards abandoned as appears by the same being thrown out of the Rough Draught. and no claim appears existing at present. but that of John Bell.

This Note of Representation A is merely inserted to shew that Edward Dunns<sup>s</sup> claim is extended towards the W.O. marked thus # W<sup>m</sup> S Davis D.S.
