



A Draught of a Tract of Land situate in Hopewell Township in Cumberland County Containing four hundred and one Acres ~~Seventy~~ perches and the Usual allowance of Six p-Cent for Roads: The Quantity of one Hundred and fifty acres forty perches & Allowance represented in the Draught by prick'd Lines was Surveyed by Zach: Butcher for Allen Killough (of whom the present Possessors purchased) and the remaining two hundred and fifty Acres one Hundred and forty five perches and Allowance was Surveyed for Thomas and William Duncan November 1762 in pursuance of two Warrants from The Honourable the Proprietaries Bearing Date as follows viz Tho<sup>s</sup> & W<sup>m</sup> Duncan the 10<sup>th</sup> of June 1762 & Allen Killough the 26<sup>th</sup> January 1744 The Quantity of two Hundred and twenty seven Acres and thirty ~~two~~ perches and Allowance was struck off for Thomas Duncan and the remaining one Hundred and seventy three acres and one Hundred and fifty ~~three~~ perches and Allowance for William Duncan as appears in the Draught in order that each may have a patent for their respective parts.
