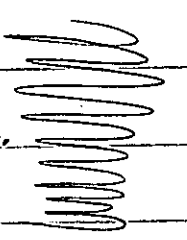

The green shading represents part of the said Bratton tract. Patented 11<sup>th</sup> July 1783, on W<sup>t</sup> of 1<sup>st</sup> August 1766 to Daniel Poyor, the red shading part of survey in name of John Gilbert W<sup>t</sup> 1<sup>st</sup> August 1766.
