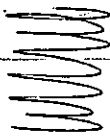

Note. The above described tract of land is in my opinion a part of Warr<sup>t</sup> No. 4201. Jos. Wilson Warrantee, said Warrant being owned by Wm. E. Dodge a Warr<sup>t</sup> No. 4201. calling for the Strawbridge survey for <sup>its</sup> western boundary, and also for the same courses, distances and corners, as the Strawbridge Warr<sup>t</sup>s, No. 158 & 209. There is however an old line shown on this draft corresponding in age, with the Survey of 4201, running also the same course, as the line on its Northwestern boundary calls for Wm. E. Dodge, probably to avoid any claims being made by others, who might claim the above described tract as being vacant land, has therefore seen fit to lay a new warrant upon the same.
