



In pursuance of a Warrant for 400<sup>acs</sup> dated the 10<sup>th</sup> day of April 1793 Granted to John ELLY was surveyed on the 19<sup>th</sup> day of August 1819 the annexed described tract of Land Containing four hundred eleven acres one hundred fifty nine perches and allowance of Six pr Cent for Roads &c Situate in Sadsbury Township Crawford County on the waters of big Coniaut. And on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of December 1826 having examined the same and found it to be correct at which time Andrew Sterling was Residing on the same with his family and had a house fit for the habitation of man and there appeared to be upwards of thirty acres of the Land Cleared fenced & in a good state of Cultivation.
