



In Pursuance of a warrant for 400 acres dated the 10th day of April A.D. 1793 granted to John Eck was surveyed on the 22^d of May A.D. 1819. The above described tract of land containing 392 acres 131 perches and allowance of six per cent for roads &c. situated in Sadesbury township, Crawford county, and at the time of making the same, John Smith was residing there on, and there was built a house fit for the habitation of man, and there appeared to be upwards of twenty acres of the land cleared, fenced and in a state of cultivation, ~~and that the same was divided as above stated between~~
