



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries the thirteenth day of August 1734 Surveyed unto William Gross a tract of Land Situate in Maxetaway adjoining to Casper Wisters Land in the County of Philad^a Beginning at a Black Oak Sapling a Corner of Casper Wisters land thence by ye same North ten degrees West Sixty perches to B. Oak thence by Vacant Land North Eighty degrees East one hundred & four perches to a post thence by land laid out to Andrew Fisher South ten degrees East one hundred and Ninety three perches to a post thence by Vacant Land South Eighty degrees West two hundred and Eight perches to a post thence by land of Casper Wister North ten degrees West one hundred and thirty three perches to a post thence by the s^d Wisters land North Eighty degrees East one hundred and four perches to ye place of Beginning. Containing Two hundred Acres with ye usual Allowance of Six p. Cent. Surveyed Sept. 12. 1734.
