Cent for Roads &c. and at the time of making said survey the said Robert Dickson — was living on the same with his family and had a covenant house and there appeared upwards of ten acres of the Land cleared and fenced. N.B. the above piece of Land is a part of a Larger tract of Land which was held by James Dickson's Improvement on the — th. day of February 1811, a warrant was granted to the said James for 400 acres of land in surveying the same it appeared, that there was more than 440^{ac} within his original marked lines and the above 64^{ac} 136 perches — was struck off, the unimproved part of said tract.
