



In pursuance of a warrant for 400 acres of land dated the 13th day of May A.D. 1814 was surveyed the twenty third day of July 1814 for John Fleming the above discribed tract of Land- Containing four Hundred one acre and one hundred forty one perches and allowance of Six $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent for Roads &c. Situate on the waters of Big Coniaut- about one mile south of the Erie County line in Crawford County Bever Township and at the time of making said survey the said John Fleming was living on the same with his family- and it appeared he had a house fit for the habitation of man and resided therein and upwards of twenty five acres Cleared and fenced in good order the greatest part thereof appeared to be in good Timothy Meadow
