Note. At the time Jacob Fulmer took out his warrant it appears by the description therein contained, that he wished to include the whole of the above diagram; but by virtue of a wrt of May 14. 1789, the western part thereof was Surveyed unto Michael Fulmore the 15<sup>th</sup> of April 1790 and is now held under that Survey. The above tract now Surveyed unto Jacob Fulmer is improved. Having seventy acres cleared and a log house and barn thereon erected. It has been improved upwards of forty years, but the precise time unknown.
