



By Virtue of a Warrant Granted to Nicholas Deck Dated the 7th day of November 1751 (the above Discribed Tract hath been Surveyed for his Use) and by the request of Martin Brown and Jacob Anspach Resurveyed the ^{17th July 1793} the same Tract According to the old Marked trees & Divided the same into two parts (to wit) No. 1. for Martin Brown Containing Forty Six Acres and Thirty two Perches & the Allowance of Six P Cent. & And part No. 2 for Jacob Anspach, Containing Sixty three Acres and thirteen perches and the Allowance of Six P. Cent for Roads & both together Containing One hundred and Nine Acres and forty five Perches & the Allowance of Six per Cent for Roads &c Situate in Tulpehocken Township in the County of Berks.
