



In pursuance of a warrant granted to Ephraim Eakman bearing date November 8<sup>th</sup> 1814 Survey'd on the first day of November following the above discribed tract of land containing one hundred fifty one acres thirty perches & allowance proportioned at six per cent including an improvement there on aparantly first commenced in the Spring of the year 1811. Situate in Donegaul Township in the County of Westmoreland
