 ground & I had never <sup>seen</sup> or heard of <sup>him</sup> since, until the 12<sup>th</sup> of this Instant neither had  
 I any knowledge of his place of abode, and the fees not having been paid, I  
 thought myself Justifiable in resurveying the survey until the fees were paid,  
 he has now secured the payment, so that I may receive it some time — At the  
 time of making the survey it was vacant all round and no Claimant but  
 Callahan's near or adjacent, I have mentioned the present adjacent Claim-  
 ants in a clumsy manner, and time will not admit this day to Bet-  
 ter it.
