



Situate on the Waters of James's Creek & near the Raystown branch of Juniata — in Hopewell township Huntingdon County Containing forty two Acres 80 perches & allowance the above is part of a tract of land Which was first Surveyed the 20<sup>th</sup> day of August 1794 in pursuance of an order N<sup>o</sup>. 541 dated the 1<sup>st</sup> day of August 1766 Granted to Robert M<sup>c</sup>Cune it then was said to Contain 151<sup>As</sup> 48<sup>Ps</sup> this part resurveyed & divided from the residue of said tract the 28<sup>th</sup> day of March 1823
