



Situate in Dover township in the County of York containing within the black lines as above set forth 48.95 & 146 perches and Allowance. Being a part of a larger tract of 287.95 & 61 perches and allowance, which was originally surveyed by George Stevenson late D. S. on the 13th day of April 1753, in pursuance of two Warrants the One for 100.95 granted to Leonard Flower dated the 25th day of April 1750. The Other for 100.95 granted to George Schlegner dated the 24th day of September 1751, and afterwards the said part was re-surveyed by the Old lines and divided off from the said larger tract, and now on the 19th day of August 1818, at the request of the present owner George Beck the same has been calculated examined and found to be correct and at his request return the Draught for confirmation
