



In Pursuance Michael Lutz and by Virtue of a Warrant dated the ninth day of February A. D. 1744 and granted to Michael Fesler surveyed November 15th A. D. 1835 the above described tract of land unto John Koehler in right of the said Michael Fesler, cit being a part of the tract held under said Warrant situate in Lower Saucon Township Northampton County And containing Thirty six acres and fifty four perches and the allowance of six per cent for roads &c
