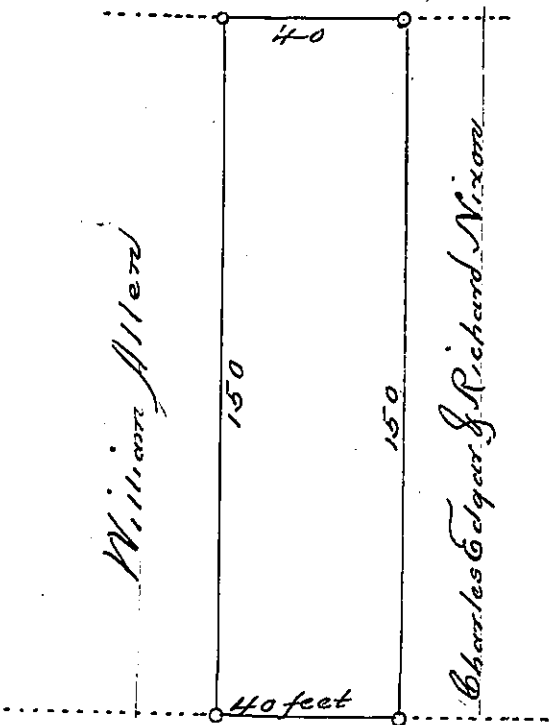


A street first laid out 30 ft. broad

Delaware Front Street

By Virtue of a Warrant from the Prop<sup>rs</sup> dated the 18<sup>th</sup> of June, 1741, surveyed on the 1<sup>st</sup> of July 1741 unto Rich<sup>d</sup> Hoarley of Philad<sup>a</sup> City, Merch<sup>t</sup> a lot of ground in the 3<sup>d</sup> City, between Pine Street & Cedar Street, bounded West<sup>rly</sup> by Delaware Front Street North<sup>rly</sup> by William Allen's Lot, East<sup>rly</sup> by a street first laid out 30 ft broad but now proposed to be enlarged to 50 & South<sup>rly</sup> by Charles Edgar's & Rich<sup>d</sup> Nixon's lot, containing in length E & W 150 ft & in breadth N & S 40 ft. Returned into the Sec<sup>y</sup>'s Office the 30<sup>th</sup> of July 1741.
