



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Hon^{ble} Proprietaries bearing date 20th March
 1743. I have surveyed and laid out unto ^{John Harris} ~~Abram~~ Peoples in the Township
 of Pennsborough in the County of Lancaster on the west side
 Susquehanna River one hundred ninety one acres of land with
 allowance of six p. Cent. Beginning at a Locust standing by the
 river being a corner of John Harris's land then by the S. land south
 eighty degrees westerly Two hundred and sixteen perches to a
 Beach, thence North ten degrees westerly one hundred and sixty
 perches to a white oak thence North eighty degrees Easterly Two
 hundred and nine perches to a Birch by the said river, then down
 the same about half a mile to the place of Beginning
