



By Virtue of a Document from the Honble Proprietaries bearing date the 31st day of October
Anno Dom 1739 surveyed to James Hall a Tract of Land in Donegal Township, containing
one hundred acres with the further addition also of sixty ~~acres~~ acres, Beginning
at a marked Hickory a corner of Ephraim Littles Land Hence North 60° East one
hundred ninety six perches to a white oak, Hence north one hundred & eleven
per to a white oak, Hence south 60° west 140 per to a Black Oak, Hence North 30°
West 30 per to a black oak, Hence south 60° West 141 per to a white oak, Hence
South 30° East 3 1/2 to a post, Hence North 50° East 20 per to a Black Oak, Hence
South 40° East 5 per to the place of Beginning, Containing in the whole one
hundred & sixty ~~acres~~ acres, with the usual allowance of six acres for a Land
for Roads &c, Surveyed the 20th day of March Anno Dom 1739/40
