The Draught of a Tract of Land Called - Situate on Penn. Creek in the County of Northumberland. Containing Eighty Three Acres & Ten perches with the usual Allowance of Six Acres per Cent for Roads &c. Surveyed the 22<sup>d</sup> Day of May Anno Dom. 1770. In Pursuance of a Warrent to Sam<sup>l</sup> Hunter Sen<sup>r</sup> for 150 Acres Bearing date at Philadelphia the 2<sup>d</sup> Day of July Anno Dom. 1762.

The first Survey made on the north side of the Creek contained 239.9 156.7<sup>a</sup> were cut off by M<sup>r</sup> Richardson and returned (as I am informed) by M<sup>r</sup> Evans in pursuance of a late Warrant and M<sup>r</sup> Hunter claims Land over the Creek to file his Warrant.
