Note. The above piece was surveyed in for Ludwick Berkhimer on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of July  
 1843. by Michael Reed then G. S. under whom Valentine Fickes has a clear Deed of  
 Conveyance Representing it to be Warranted land, and tax has been paid for it  
 by them ever since, <sup>by them</sup> about 1/4 of an acre is cleared land, the line cuts that much off from a  
 field that is cleared on the Jennings Survey. This was not expected by the Parties.
