



Situate in Washington Township, York County, containing within the black lines as above set forth, Seven acres, One hundred and forty perches, and allowance of six per cent for roads &c.<sup>a</sup> Being part of a larger tract of 90 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> <sup>ac</sup> & allowance. Originally Surveyed by Charles Lukens, late D.S. on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of June A.D. 1766 in pursuance of a Warrant granted to Adam Lohman for —<sup>ac</sup> dated the 7<sup>th</sup> day of August 1765. The above part resurveyed and divided off from the said larger tract for John Grove the present owner of said part, at whose request the same is returned for confirmation January 29<sup>th</sup> 1822.
