



The above is a draft of a tract of land containing one hundred and seventy-five acres being part of the peninsula at Erie known as Presque Isle. Which said draft was protracted from a description given in the Act of the General Assembly of Pennsylvania, approved April 29th, 1903, Pamphlet Laws, page 336, which authorized the conveyance, by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, to the commissioners of the Water Works of the City of Erie, and by virtue of which a patent was granted on the twenty-sixth day of February, 1904, a record of which appears in Patent Book H. Vol. 76 page 361.
