



A Draught of a Tract of Land Situate in Maccorgy Township in the County of Northampton in the State of Pennsylvania Containing One hundred and three acres and 6 Perches of Land, together with the usual allowance for roads. That was formerly Surveyed by Edward Scull for Christian Gorr by Warrant of the 1st March Anno — 1744. The same was afterwards divided Anno — 1758, the greatest Part thereof is now belonging to George Gorr Junior, and the Remainder to George Kibler Son of Philip Kibler. Partly resurveyed for them on the 21st-22d October 1783.
