



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the fourth day of April, 1734 Surveyed unto Samuel ^{Hought} a Tract of Land situate near a branch of Tobacco called the Daepwood, adjoining to William Allens Land, Beginning at a Black oak a Corner of Wm. Allens Land, thence by the same South East two hundred perches to a post thence by Vacant Land North East one hundred and seventy perches to a post, thence by Vacant Land North West two hundred perches to a post thence by Vacant Land South West one hundred and seventy perches to the place of Beginning, containing two hundred acres with the usual allowance of six 1/2 Cents. Surveyed October 25th, 1734 By Nich^o. Duell

Returned into the Secretarys Office the 28th of 10th mo. 1734.
