



By Virtue of a warrant from the Proprietaries dated the 9<sup>th</sup> Day of October 1734 for Surveying unto George Dutwich Hawes one hundred acres of Land on Westside of Tulpehocken adjoining to land lately belonging to James Logart. There was surveyed a certain Tract of Land situate on a branch of the said creek called the Mill-Back, Beginning at a post in a line of land late of John Seller, thence by the same & Vacant land S. E. by S. one hundred & forty p<sup>ches</sup> to a post, Thence by Vacant the four courses & Distances next following viz: N. E. by E. forty three p<sup>ches</sup> to a post, S. E. by S. sixty p<sup>ches</sup> to a post, N. E. by E. ninety seven p<sup>ches</sup> to a White Oak & N. W. by N. two hundred p<sup>ches</sup> to a post near a small Hickory marked, Thence by Adreas Datzgebers Land S. W. by W. one hundred & forty p<sup>ches</sup> to the place of Beginning containing one hundred & forty nine acres & one hundred & <sup>forty one</sup> ~~thirty two~~ p<sup>ches</sup>, and an allowance of Six p<sup>cent</sup> for Roads &c. Survey'd y<sup>e</sup> 22<sup>nd</sup> Day of Oct. 1735
