



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries bearing date the 16<sup>th</sup> day of September Anno Dom. 1735, Surveyed on the 16<sup>th</sup> day of March Anno Dom. 1735/6 to be Christian Hearsey a Tract of Land in the Township of Hempfield & County of Lancaster Beginning at a Hickory a Corner of Isaac Norris's Land thence South East by Souths 285 per to a Hickory thence North East by East 104 per to a Black Oak, thence North West by North 86 per to a post, thence North East by East 20 per to a Black Oak, thence North West by North 136 per to a White Oak, thence North East by East 23 per to a Black Oak, thence North West by North 51 per to a Black Oak, thence South 85 deg, West 140 per to an Ash thence South 10 deg East 60 per to the place of Beginning, containing Two hundred twenty six acres & 1/2 with the usual allowance of six acres for Roads &c.
