



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor dated the 30th Day of April Anno Dom. 1737. The above described Tract of Land was surveyed unto James Hart, in the Township of Tulpehocken in the County of Lancaster, Beginning at a Hickery by Tulpehocken Creek Thence North 60 degrees East by the Improvement of James Taylor 160 perches to a post thence South 30 degrees East by Vacant land 202 perches to a small Hickery by the River Schuylkill, then down the same on the several courses thereof 140 perches to the mouth of Tulpehocken Creek. Thence up the same on the several courses ^{thereof} 233 perches to the place of Beginning, Containing One hundred and twenty acres beside the allowance of Six Percent for Roads.
