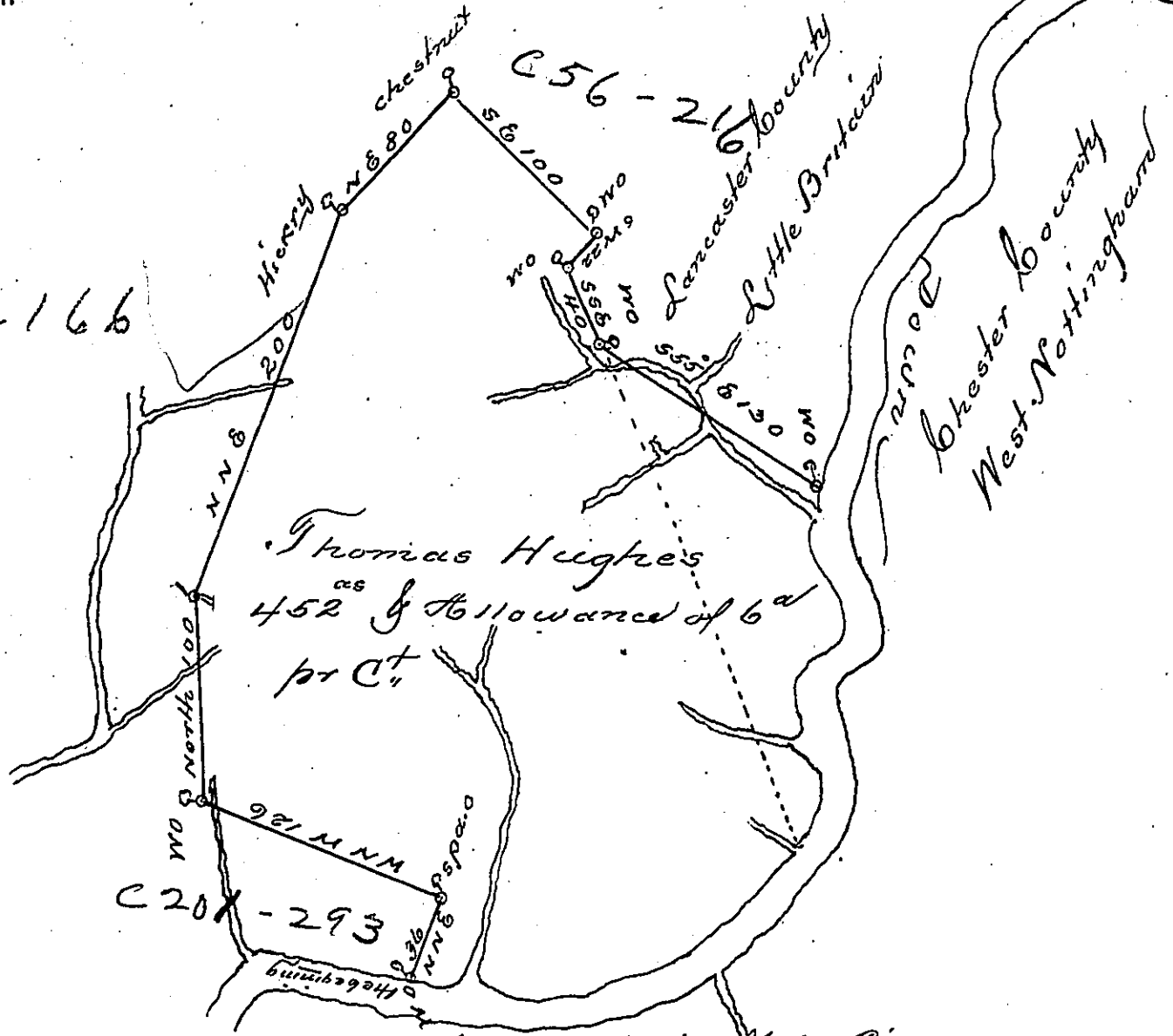

The bounds in right of Josiah Paine from the Proprietaries

By Virtue of a Warrant to me directed bearing date October 3rd 1741. Survey'd unto Thomas Hughes on 4th day of the 3rd mo: 1742. a tract of land Situate in y^e Township of Little Britain - & County of Lancaster. Beginning at a Corner white Oak standing by y^e side of Octoraro - on Lancaster shore opposite to Thomas Coulson's land. Running thence NNE 36 perches to a Spanish Oak Sapling thence WNW 126 perches to a White Oak, thence North 100 perches to a post, thence NNW 200 perches to a Hickory, thence North East 80 perches to a chestnut, thence South East 100 perches to a White Oak, thence South west 22 perches to a White Oak, thence S.S.E. 40 perches to a White Oak, thence South 55 degrees Easterly - Down a small Branch to a white oak Corner Stand - thence by y^e several courses of y^e break to y^e Beginning on y^e bank of Octoraro about 4 perches Northward of y^e mouth of y^e branch aforesaid, containing Four hundred & fifty two acres & y^e allowance of six acres per hundred for Roads &c.
