



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor dated the 25<sup>th</sup> of January Anno Domini 1737  
 There was a Tract of Land Surveyed unto George Hair on the 18<sup>th</sup> of the second month  
 1738, in Heidelberg Township Lancaster County, Beginning at a White Oak in the line of other land  
 of the s<sup>d</sup> Hair, thence South 63° East by Vacant Land 108 ps. to a W. Oak, thence East by the same  
 40 perches to a post, thence North by the Improvement of Ulrich Michael 74 ps. to a  
 post, thence East by D<sup>o</sup> 48 ps. to a post, thence North 34° West by land of the s<sup>d</sup> George Hair, 102  
 ps. to a Chestnut tree, thence S 80° W by the same 27 ps. to a Chestnut tree, thence North 10  
 deg. West by D<sup>o</sup> 20 perches to a Black Oak, thence S. 55° West by Vacant Land 65 ps. to a post,  
 in a line of his other land thence along the same South 12° West 40 ps. to a post, thence South  
 36° West by s<sup>d</sup> land 60 ps. to s<sup>d</sup> place of Beginning. Containing one hundred and two acres,  
 beside the allowance of six p<sup>er</sup> Cent <sup>the same</sup> And also in pursuance of ~~another~~ <sup>the same</sup> warrant  
~~Bearing date the~~ The smaller Tract above described was surveyed  
 unto the said George Hair, Containing Twenty <sup>3/4</sup> ~~two~~ acres, Beside the usual al-  
 lowance, the 21<sup>st</sup> of December, 1739.
