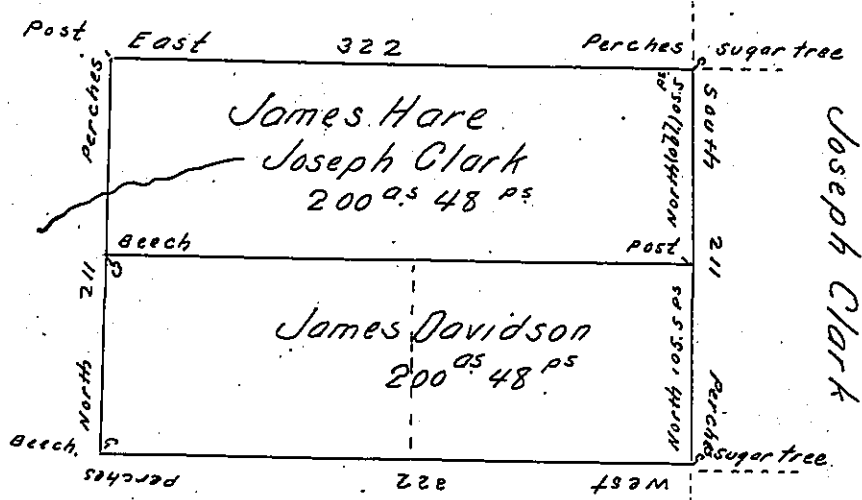

In Pursuance of a warrant for 400 acres dated the twenty first day of April 1794 granted to James Hare was surveyed on the second day of July A. D. 1817. The above described tract of land containing 400 acres 96 perches and allowance of six per cent for roads, &c. situated in Fairfield township Crawford county and at the time of making the same James Davidson was residing there on and there was built a house fit for the habitation of man and there appeared to be upwards of Nine acres of the land cleared, fenced and in a state of cultivation (ob.) that the same was divided as above stated between Joseph Clark and James Davidson.
