



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Hon^{ble} Proprietaries bearing Date the Twenty first of febr^y Anno Dom 1737. I have Surveyd and Laid Out unto George Hall in ye Township of Pennsborough in the County of Lancaster on the west Side Susquehanna River Two hundred forty and four Acres of Land with allowance of 6 p. Cent. Beginning at a Black-Oak a Corner of David Bayleys Land Thence South Eighty four Degrees Easterly One hundred and fifty two perches to a Chestnut-Oak. Thence South Twenty Degrees Westerly (by land of Rich^d Fulton) Two hundred and Ninety perches to a post. Thence North Seventy Degrees Westerly one hundred and forty Seven perches to a Post in the Line of Sam^l Halls land Thence North Twenty Degrees Easterly Two hundred and fifty six perches to the place of Beginning.
