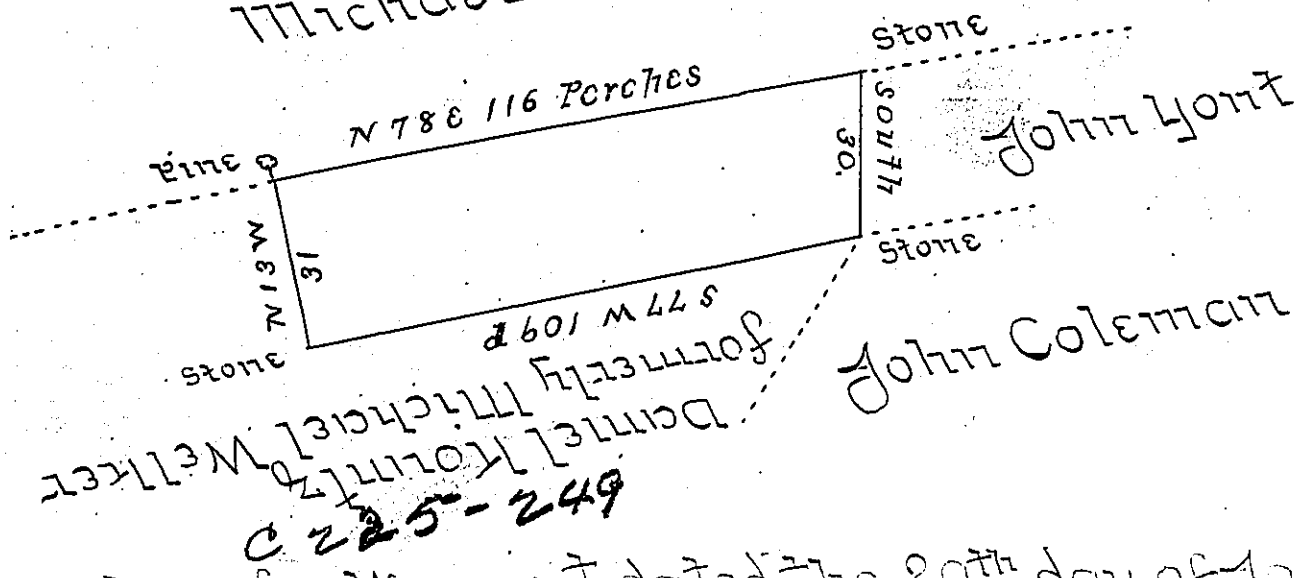

Memorandum Taken at the Time of Surveying About seven years ago Michael Riesinger Cleared About Seven Acres of the Above mentioned Land and About Two Weeks ago built a small Cabin on it but at the same time it appears that Michael Riesinger well knew that the Above mentioned Warrant was taken out John Hoyt by a prior Warrant took in that part of the land - (called for by the Warrant Above mentioned) which lies in Berks County - So that the Remainder - thereof Surveyed to Jacob Hoogman and Peter Trogg all lies in Dauphin County -
