



Whereas James Dysart obtained a Warrant for the above described tract of land dated May 17<sup>th</sup> 1734 and procured a Survey thereon: but the conditions of said Warrant not having been complied with by said Dysart: the said Warrant and Survey thereon became void and Whereas Joseph Hall (he agreeing to pay the consideration Money which ought to have been paid by said Dysart for the same) obtained a Warrant for said tract of land bearing date the 24<sup>th</sup> day of December 1748 Wherefore in pursuance of the said last mentioned Warrant have Surveyed the above described tract of land unto the said Joseph Hall situate on the Waters of Doc Run in Londonderry Township Chester County containing 113 1/2<sup>acs</sup> & allowance of six Per Cent & c Surveyed April 19<sup>th</sup> 1808
