



The draugh of a tract of land situate in Potter Township Centre County containing one hundred and eight acres fifty three perches and allowance of six per cent for roads &c. Surveyed the 30<sup>th</sup> day of April 1811 in pursuance of a warrant granted to James Galbraith dated the 11<sup>th</sup> day of March 1811. On the above described premises there is a number of Peach trees, a few apple trees, about four or five acres of cleared land on which there has been several crops of grain raised, a small cabbir house and part of James Galbraith's family lived in the same and from the best information the land was improved in the spring of 1802
