 afterwards divided off from the said larger Tract of Land  
 And now at the Request of the present owner George Wil-  
 liams I am desired to make Return of the Draught as Cal-  
 culated examined and Corrected the 21<sup>st</sup> day of August  
 Anno Domini 1809.
