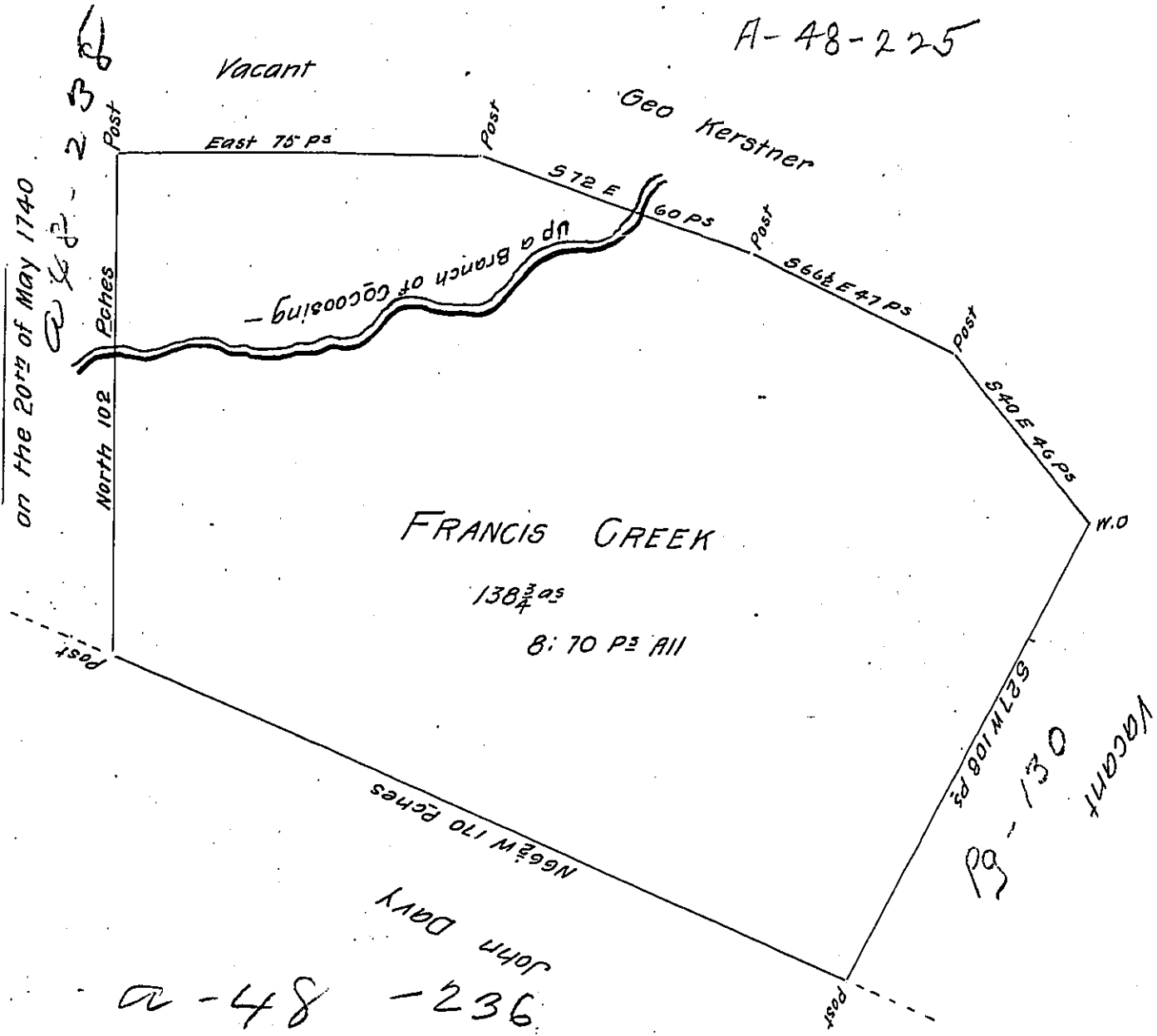

By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the 12th day of March ¹⁷³⁴ ~~1737~~

There was laid out unto Francis Creek. A Certain tract of land situate on Cacoosing Creek in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a Post in a Line of John Dary's Land thence extending by the same North 66 1/2 Deg^s West One hundred & seventy Pches to a Post thence along a Line of the Minister's Land North One hundred and two Pches to a Post thence by Vacant Land East seventy five Pches to a Post thence by George Kersner's land South 72 Deg^s East Sixty Pches to a Post and South 66 1/2 Deg^s East forty seven Pches to a Post and South 40 Deg^s East forty six Pches to a White Oak thence by Vacant land South 27 Deg^s West One hundred & eight Pches to the place of Beginning. Containing One hundred & thirty eight acres & three quarters of an acre and allowance of 6 P. C^t for Roads &c. Surveyd ye 15th day of July A^o Dⁱ 1737
