



By Warrant from the Proprietaries of the 10th March last Survey'd unto Hugh Jones on the 1st May 1733. A Tract of land Situate on a branch of Schoolkill Galled Angelica Run in the County of Lancaster. Begining at a Hickery on the North side of the 5^d Branch thence West by Vacant land 300 Pches to a Black Oak, thence South 120 Pches to a Black Oak, thence South 70^d Easterly 101 Pches to a Post Thence North 62^d Easterly along a Barren Mountain 250 Pches to a White Oak, thence North North West 41 Pches to the place of Begining. Containing two hundred acres and the allowance of six acres P. Cent.

Upon Samuel Lightfoots trying the lines of this land on the 10th 2^o mo. 1738 at Jane Jones's request he found that the line here drawn next the barren mountain called N 62 E 250 Per was not run & he attempt-
ing to run it accordingly found it would cut of the run ^{of Water} w^{ch} would be very injurious to the purchaser he therefore run the lines to include the run w^{ch} took in ²³¹ 238 a^s & allow w^{ch} he judged would not injure the the Prop^{rs} adjoin^g land. This Return was thereupon made void & another according to S. Lightfoots Survey made. See another Draught &c.
