



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor dated the fourth day of June Anno Dom 1735. The above described tract of land was Surveyed unto David Jones in the Township of Gumru in the County of Lancaster. Begining at a Black Oak at ye Corner of a tract of land belonging to the said David Jones. Thence South 65 degrees West by Vacant land 82 Perches to a Post. thence North 15 degrees West by ye land of Henry Harry 80 Perches to a Post. thence North 48 degrees East by Vacant land 250 Perches to a Post in the Line of Thomas Nicholas. Thence South 30 degrees East by the same and Vacant land 150 Perches to a Post. Thence South 41 degrees West by other land of the said Jones 10 Perches to a White Oak. Thence West by South by the same 170 Perches to a Gum tree. Thence South by East by ye said land 40 Perches to the place of Begining. Containing One hundred and fifty acres. Beside the allowance of six P. Cent.
