Surveyed for William Allison the 12th of May 1772. by Virtue of a special Order No 1075. Returned into the Surveyor Genl^s Office as containing 298 acs 14.7 Ps Situate on a small branch of Turtel Creek. In Plum^b Township in the County of Allegheny, the dotted lines represent the remaining part of the Tract, belonging to the Heirs of John Brown. The said one hundred acres of land was conveyed by John Brown & his Wife to Arch^d Barde Esq in trust for the said Th^s Beatty
