



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor dated the 19th day of 4^o 1st mo. Anno Dom. 1734. The above described tract of land was surveye unto John Henry in the Township of Hanover, in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a White Oak, thence West by the Settlement of Robert Patrick 122 perches to a small Black Oak, thence North 10 degrees West by Vacant Land 42 perches to a Dogwood tree. thence West 60 perches to a White Oak, thence North 10 degrees West by Vacant Land 174 perches to a Black Oak, thence North 80 degrees East by the Blue Mountain 186 perches to a post, thence South 30 degrees east by Vacant Land 168 perches to a Dogwood. thence South 10 Degrees East
