



Where as an order from Richard Peter Late Secretary Dated the third day of September 1742 to Nicholas Scull Late Surveyor General ordered to Survey a tract of land for George Henton Adjoining his other land in Exeter township Philadelphia County (now Berks) there was Surveyed made by Edward Scull then Deputy Surveyor on the 16th day of July 1743 for George Henton as it appears on the Field Books of Edward Scull and Resurveyed the above Described Tract of land for John Bishop as he is the Last purchaser Situate in Exeter township Berks County Containing one Hundred and Sixteen acres and 18 perches and the Allowance of Six Percent this 22 day of August 1794.
