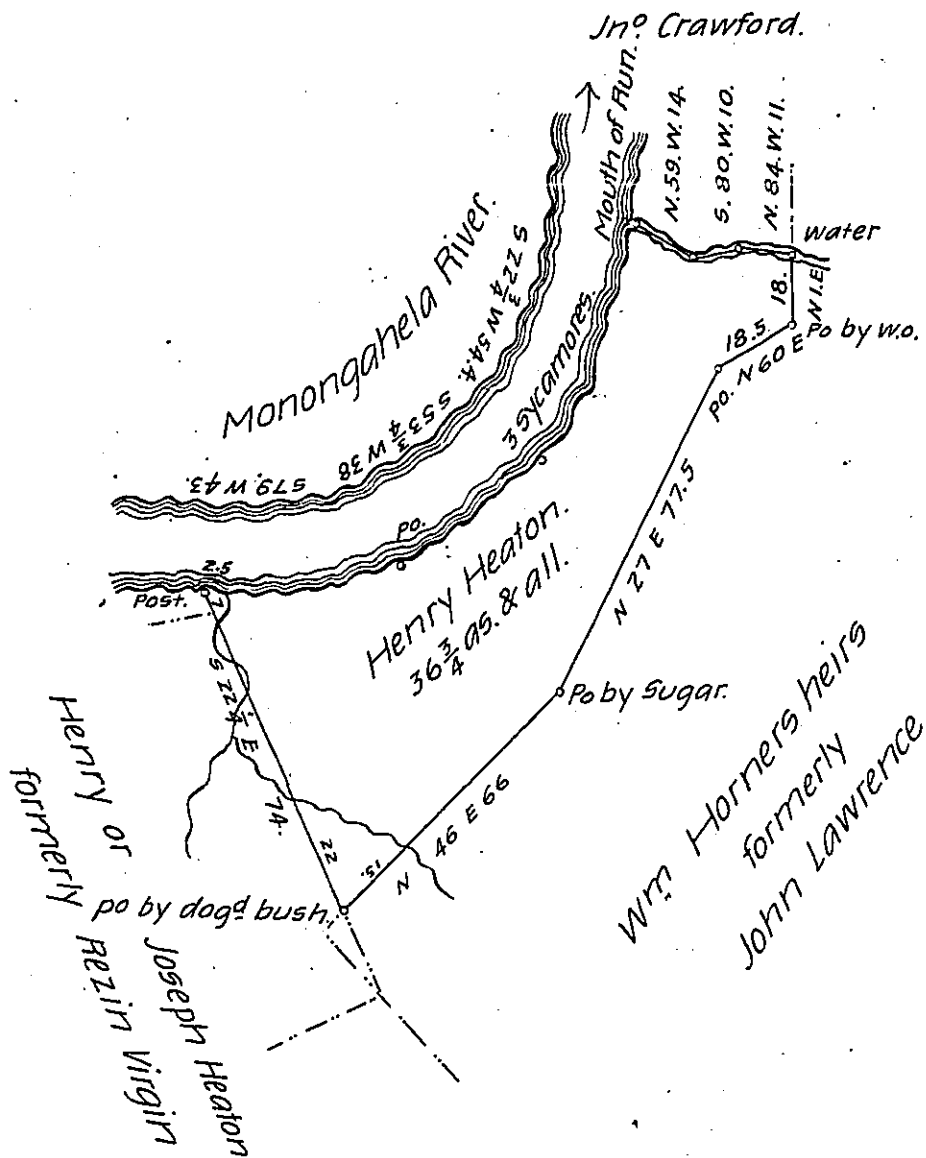


Note: there is a small interference of the Jno Lawrence survey with Virgin (pt dotted line) but Virgin is the oldest and I suppose they are both patented. F.L.



Situate on the southeasterly side of the Monongahela River in Luzerne township, Fayette County and surveyed the 29th day of April 1833. In pursuance of a warrant in the name of Jobl Heaton for 50 acres of Land, dated the 14th day of January 1833. there is 7 or 8 acres cleared, a stone and 3 small frame dwelling houses; also a Grist mill & Sawmill, ~~on this part~~ and three families of the heirs of Henry Heaton now residing on this tract. the improvement appears to be near 30 years old.
