



Draft of twenty acres and ^{one} hundred and twenty ₂ perches of land with six per cent for Roads situate in Greenwood township in Mifflin county surveyed 27th September 1814 in pursuance of a warrant to Joseph Hendricks dated 1st Aug 1814.

Note, The Warrentees family were living in a new house on the above represented land at time of survey; and there were, also on it, about four square perches of ground that appeared to be an old clearing, but had not been for many years used, the fences, if it had any, were either burned down or had been taken away, which old improvement, shewn on draft by dots, is claimed by Michael Hahn. Note also all the land shewn by the above draft is included in a survey made 4th April 1814 by Simon Snyder Jnr for Michael Hahn on Warrant to Harman Born dated 3d November 1772.
