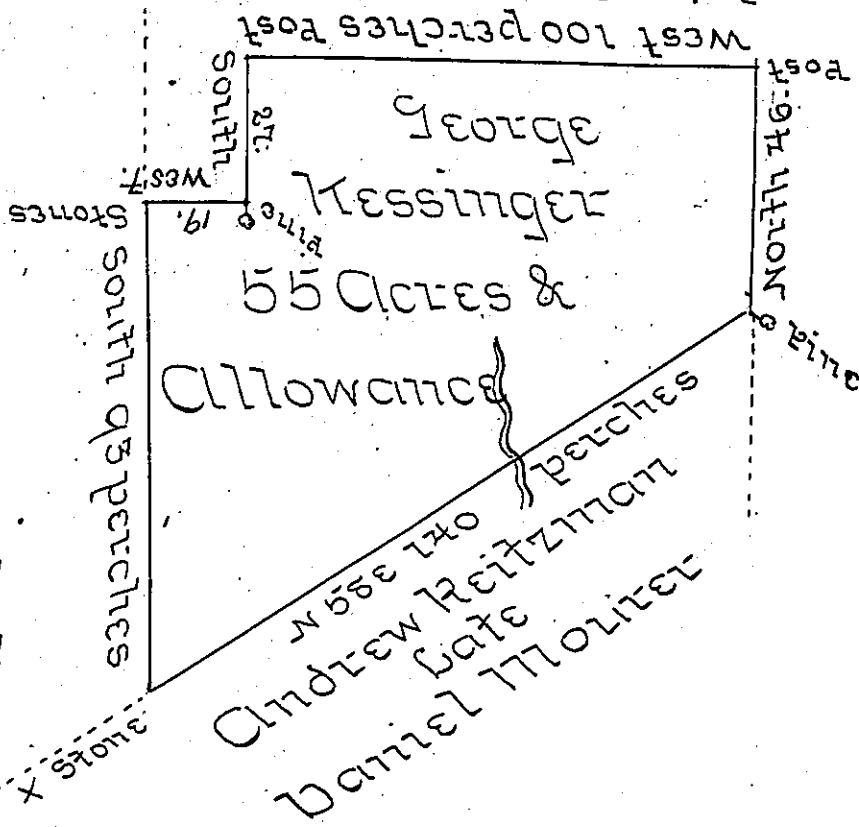

fence sowed with Wheat by the Best Information

therein nor no Appearance thereof
