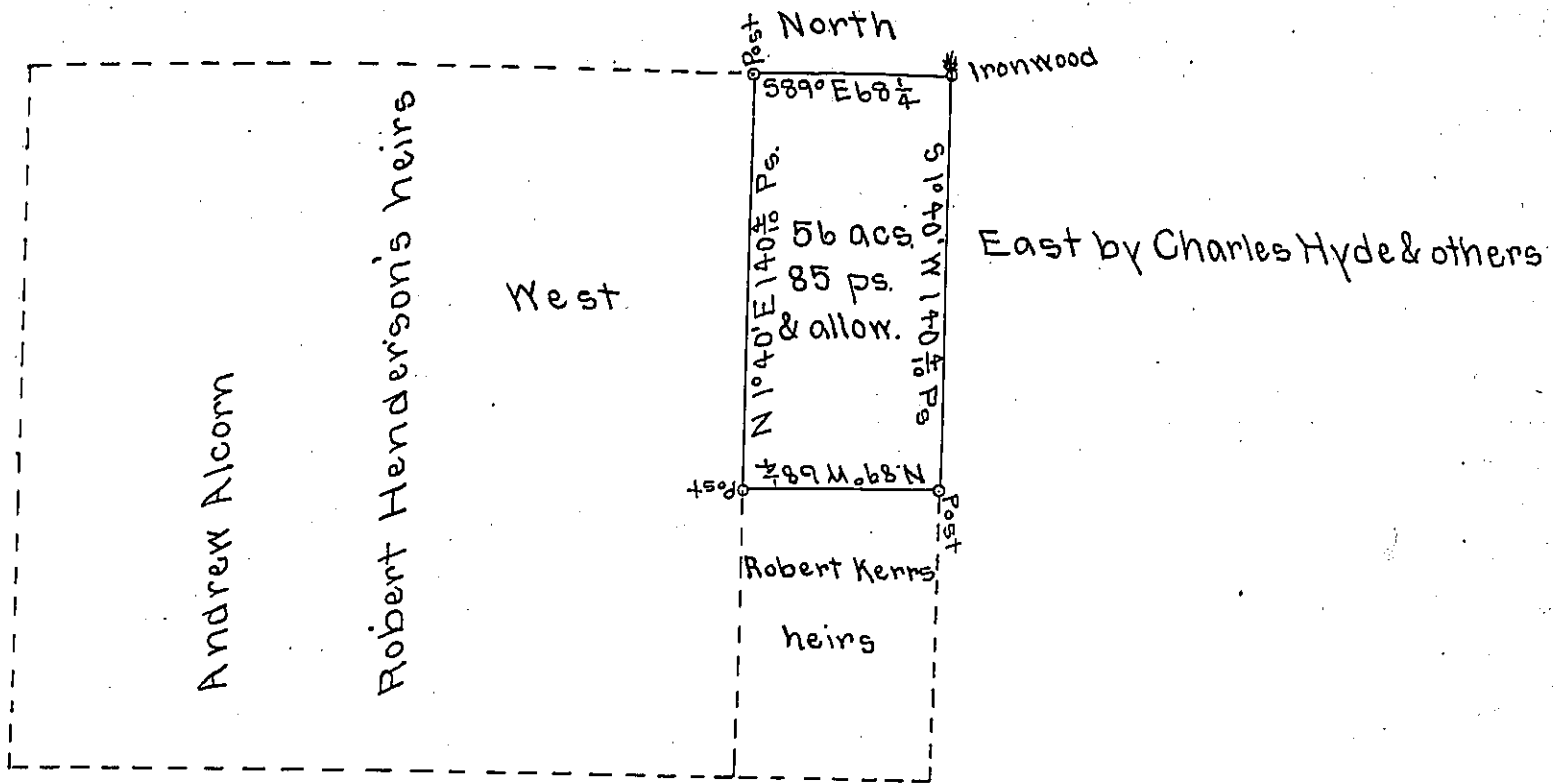


B. Shelmadine
