



Draught of two hundred and twenty one acres and twenty one perches of land situate in Beale Township Juniata County with six per cent allowance being composed of four separate Surveys to wit..

No. 1. Containing 80 acres & 66 perches with six per cent allowance. Surveyed on a Warrant to John Harris dated June 11<sup>th</sup> 1801 and Resurveyed May 3<sup>d</sup> 1865 on an order of Resurvey to Thomas Harris one of the heirs of John Harris dated Oct. 5<sup>th</sup> 1820

No. 2. Containing 19 acres & 154 perches with six per cent allowance Surveyed on a Warrant to Alexander Harris dated Dec. 9<sup>th</sup> 1864

No. 3. Containing fifty two acres and ninety three perches with six per cent allowance Surveyed on a warrant to Jonathan Kearsley dated February 4<sup>th</sup> 1773

No. 4. Containing 68 acres & 28 perches of land with Six per cent allowance Surveyed on a Warrant to William Buchanan dated Nov. 24<sup>th</sup> 1813 Surveyed the above four tracts into one May 3<sup>d</sup> 1865 at the instance of Alexander and John Harris the present owners for the purpose of Patenting.
